Open Source Software

DEFINITION

Open source software (OSS) is computer software whose source code is available to the public under a license that permits users to use, change, and improve the software, and to redistribute it in modified or unmodified form. It is often developed in a public, collaborative manner (Source: Wikipedia).

IMPACT ON e-BUSINESS

The open source movement is a phenomenon that is based on **collaboration** and **sharing**, two typical Internet paradigms. The practical part is that virtually everybody has access to the thus created software (or other open source work), its use, its modification, distribution etc. without being asked for a monetary remuneration. However, the use of OSS is subject to a license, a so-called Open Source Software License.
